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EDII Ahmedabad Engages Industry Experts on Inclusive Enterprise Development and Entrepreneurship Education

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Kolkata, 7 March 2025: The Entrepreneurship Development Institute of India (EDII), Ahmedabad, continues to drive entrepreneurship and inclusive growth through its education programs and social initiatives. The discussions at the Roundtable Meet were a natural extension of EDII's larger efforts to cultivate a strong entrepreneurial ecosystem. The institute's postgraduate diploma programmes, which have produced a high success rate among graduates, serve as a critical foundation for fostering new ventures. These programmes not only equip students with the skills to navigate the entrepreneurial journey but also instill a culture of innovation and self-reliance, values that align directly with the goals of the SABAL initiative.

According to a recent survey, 78% of EDII's postgraduate (PG) alumni have pursued successful entrepreneurial careers, with a substantial number contributing to family businesses, launching start-ups, or leading social enterprises. EDII offers two specialised, AICTE-approved programmes:

Post Graduate Diploma in Management—Entrepreneurship (PGDM-E): A two-year, full-time programme that provides specialisation in New Enterprise Creation, Family Business Management, and Social Entrepreneurship.
Post Graduate Diploma in Management—Innovation, Entrepreneurship, & Venture Development (PGDM-IEV): A milestone-based learning approach focusing on business model development, market validation, and start-up incubation at EDII's CrAdLE incubator.

With a 42-year legacy, EDII has supported over 1,000 family businesses, incubated 100+ start-ups, and built a thriving network of 1,800+ successful alumni. The institute is accredited by the National Board of Accreditation (NBA) and is a recipient of the USASBE Outstanding Entrepreneurship Programme Abroad Award (2014). Their outcome-based courses are designed to align with market needs and industry

demands. Beyond a robust core curriculum and diverse electives, students benefit from specialised seminars, milestone-based learning, expert mentorship, and handson exposure to tech-driven businesses, ensuring a holistic and practical education.

Expanding the Entrepreneurial Ecosystem Through Inclusive Development

Building upon a strong foundation, EDII is actively working with corporate partners to expand entrepreneurial opportunities beyond traditional demographics. The pivotal roundtable meeting brainstormed on creating a better world for PwDs through an effective synergy between government, corporates, and institutions. The discussions revolved around the specific objectives of ensuring the empowerment of PwDs:

• Best practices for PwD inclusion in entrepreneurship, from infrastructure improvements workplace integration. to • Aligning the initiative with Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) to ensure longterm impact. • Strengthening corporate and institutional support for PwD-led enterprises. Participating corporates committed to impactful interventions, including: Community Sensitisation Campaigns to promote PwD inclusion. Immersive Life Skills Training for adolescents with disabilities. Business Opportunity Sourcing to help PwDs establish ventures. Credit Linkage Support for PwD-led businesses. Entrepreneur Growth-Cum-Counselling Programmes (EGCP) to mentor PwD entrepreneurs. • Micro-Skillpreneurship Development Programme (MSDP) to equip unemployed PwDs with business skills.
